Safety tips for driving on Route 389:

- ◆ Fill up before leaving and make sure you know where the gas stations are along the way.
- ◆ Drive at a speed that is appropriate for your skill level, the state of your vehicle, and the road conditions—and obey the speed limit.
- ◆ If you need to pull over, do so in a safe place and make sure you are visible to other drivers.
- ◆ Before leaving, check your battery and tires (including the spare tire), and oil and antifreeze levels.
- ◆ Check the weather and road conditions.

The essentials:

- ◆ Flashlight
- ◆ First aid kit
- ◆ Non-perishable food items
- ◆ Matches or a lighter
- ◆ Candles
- ◆ Blanket
- ◆ Water

Some helpful items:

- ◆ Electrical tape
- ◆ Portable compressor
- ◆ Set of wrenches
- ◆ Pliers, screwdrivers, hammer
- ◆ Shovel, axe
- ◆ Rope

In case of a breakdown, flat tire, or accident:

- ◆ Jumper cables
- ◆ Traction aids
- ◆ Gas siphon hose

If you are travelling in the winter:

- ◆ Warm clothes
- ◆ Winter boots
- ◆ Lock deicer
- ◆ Methanol (wood alcohol, to keep gas from freezing)
